



## Developing and Implementing Emergency Action Plans: Facilitator Guide for Activities Administrators

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### Prior to Working with Coaches and Event Staff

    - a. Evaluate access to AEDs.
    - b. Work with your district's health and safety team and administrative staff to find solutions for access to AEDs.
    - c. The suggested access time to an AED is three minutes or less.
  - 4) Establish a Communication Plan--Work with local EMS, athletic trainers and other critical medical team members to ensure that the following information is posted and available to those activating EMS:
    - a. The street address and directions to guide EMS,
    - b. Location of the nearest AED,
    - c. List of emergency numbers and call order.

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## Introduce Emergency Action Plans to Coaches/Advisors

- 1) Discuss the value and importance of the ACSAL Emergency Action Plan program.
  - 2) Discuss the steps below to ensure your staff is developing Student Response Teams.
    - a. Every coach/advisor must establish a Student Response Team to ensure quick help for victims or injured players.

    - d. Instruct the coach/advisor to discuss the Response Protocol's purpose with their team.
    - e. Notes on developing an EAP:
      1. Identify students trained in CPR willing to join the CPR/AED team and assign them first.
      2. Assign students to the remaining teams.
    - f. The coach/advisor should ensure they have a copy of their completed EAP in an accessible location. This may be an electronic file saved on a phone or other readily available electronic device or a printed copy placed in a medical kit, clipboard or other location.
  - 3) Coach/advisor should periodically review team duties with the students.
  - 4) Coach/advisor should practice the EAP with their teams.
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## Work with Event Staff

Event staff should:

- Understand the importance of the Anyone Can Save a Life program.
- Know and practice Emergency Action Plans (EAP) for venues.
- Know the locations of AEDs
- Be trained in the use of AEDs and CPR.
- Share the venue's EAP and AED locations with other event staff (officials, workers, outside vendors, opposing schools, etc.).



## Provide Training on Automated Electronic Defibrillators (AEDs) and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)
